

OUR BEGINNINGS

1960 THE LATE K JOEL IKONEN FIRST CAME TO SINGAPORE FROM FINLAND

God led Rev Kaarlo Joel Ikonen, then a young missionary from the Finnish Free Foreign Mission to Singapore to share the gospel with the people in this country. The following year his fiancee Pirkko, who later became his wife, joined him in Singapore. They were based in Zion Church (presently Zion Full Gospel Church), and went about in parts of Singapore such as Kampong San Teng (presently Bishan), Hylam Sua (presently Shunfu Estate) and Kim Chuan Road to share the Gospel. They conducted open-air meetings and to draw people to these meetings, simple and lively songs were sung accompanied with music on the accordion played by Rev Joel Ikonen.

Apart from these, "big-top" tent meetings (which could seat more than 100 people) were set up for up to a week at different locations. Nightly gospel sharing meetings and day time bible stories sessions would be held at these tent meetings.

1967 STARTED A HOUSE-CHURCH AT NO 2. JALAN RABU

In response to God's leading, the late Rev and Mrs K Joel Ikonen rented a 2-storey semi-detached house at No. 2 Jalan Rabu and started its first service with a handful of local Christians.

1971 MOVED TO A SHOP-HOUSE AT NO. 9 KALIDASA AVE

By late 1971, it was obvious that the home-church was not large enough to accommodate a growing congregation. A search for new premises culminated in a move to a shop house No. 9 Kalidasa Avenue (in Teacher's Estate) that had a seating capacity of about 70.

1981 MOVED TO A FORMER SUPERMARKET AT NO.1-7 THOMSON HILLS DRIVE

As the membership grew steadily to more than 100 people, the church had to move once again. This time, it is to our current premises which God had graciously provided at No. 1-7 Thomson Hills Drive. Formerly a supermarket, the premise has 4 connecting shophouse units. The church could now seat more than 200 people.

INDEPENDENT CHURCH

With God's grace and mercy, Salem Chapel grew in size gradually and steadily. Originally founded and supported by the Finnish Free Foreign Mission, Salem Chapel became an independent church, wholly financed by the locally grown congregation and served by its appointed pastors.

2020/1 SALEM RENEWAL PROJECT (SRP)

The Salem Renewal Project (SRP) was conceived and carefully planned over the course of 2 years. The RENEWAL project – it is a juxtaposition of the external and the internal; the natural and spiritual. It began as a spiritual renewal when the Elders, Pastors and Leaders of Salem Chapel looked at the health of the church and sought the Lord for a fresh outpouring of the Holy Spirit on the next generation. Even as plans were put in place for the training of Next Generation leaders, it was acknowledged that the physical premises of the church also needed a renewal.

The SRP project was completed by Oct 2021. On 21 November 2021, we had our first Sunday Worship Service at the renovated church premises.
