MY JOURNEY WITH THE YOUTHS : FROM AUNTY TO LEADER OF YOUTHS

Who would have thought that at 50, I would be leading a youth ministry; mentoring and shepherding the youths. ME, an aunty and a mother of two!

What could I possibly know about the struggles, dreams, and energy of young people? But God's ways are higher than ours, and when He calls, He equips.

This is my story-a journey of tears, laughter and divine surprises!

From Burnout to Breakthrough

After leading the Youth Ministry with Joel Neo, then Youth Chairman, for a year in 2015, I was close to being burnt out. The weight of this responsibility was overwhelming, and I questioned myself if I was even supposed to be doing this.

It was while at Tung Ling Bible School in 2016, God spoke clearly that He wanted me to "work for and with the next generation" and be a spiritual mother to them. That confirmation became my anchor through countless storms and rocky waters.

Little did I know, this was not just a temporary assignment-it was a destiny shift!

From serving the elderly in Hokkien Ministry for a decade, I had to step into a completely different world. I had to learn, unlearn, and relearn what it meant and took to connect with youths. It was sometimes uncomfortable, messy, and humbling, it was also one of the most transformative ad fulfilling seasons of my life.

The Coolest Aunty in Town?

One of the best moments for me came from an unlikely source—a "cool" youth who told me casually, "You're the coolest Aunty I know!" That affirmation meant the world to me.

It was not about trying to be cool or hip; it was about being myself and being real. Authenticity became my mantra. I learned to be vulnerable, to laugh at myself, and to step out of my comfort zone.

Hosting and cooking dinner for youths at my home? Hanging out with them for late night suppers? Joining in their crazy fun games at Youth Camps? Going on mission trips? These were things I never imagined myself doing at this stage of my life. But somehow, God gave me the energy and joy to keep up with them.
